Further consideration is based on the students' essays, self-assessments, descriptions of activities, school recommendations and school transcripts. The Commission on Presidential Scholars makes the final selection of Scholars. One young man and one young woman will be selected from each state with 15 students-at-large, and up to 20 students from creative and performing arts. The U.S. Department of Education will announce the Scholars in May.
