Maria Martin is a concerned mother of two teenagers. Maria lives in Billerica, Massachusetts, is very concerned about what her children are learning in school and what and how they are learning in general. She will also be discussing modern technology trends, and will ask some very important questions. "Is social Media the departure from human touch?"
