The Iron River Singers are a well-known northern style native singing group. The members are made up of a number of native nations including Chippewa, Wampanoag, and Abenaki. The original members started singing together when they were between 11 and 13 years old and have now performed around the

country for over 25 years. The Iron River Singers have won many contests across the nation as well as internationally.
