FRIDAY, JUNE 24

If the weather permits, check out Campfire Night at the YMCA Dartmouth (267 Gulf Rd., Dartmouth). Bring the family along for a fun summer evening activity. Enjoy the outdoors with a campfire — there will be storytelling, songs, and most importantly- s'mores! Cost is \$10 per family and the night begins at 6:30pm.



Or start the weekend with a few opportunities to support local music. The New Music Festival kicks off Friday evening from 6pm-11pm. This is a great event with over 30 local, Southeastern New England bands and musicians. This is a two-day festival and is held at Artists' Exchange (90 Rolfe Square, Cranston) in Cranston, RI. SATURDAY, JUNE 25

With beach season practically upon us, it's the perfect time to think about summer safety. The American Red Cross Fall River (315 Pleasant St., Fall River) is holding their Standard First Aid with CPR course on Saturday morning from 9am-3pm.
