
YWCA appeals to local businesses to meet fundraising goals for historic Levi Standish House

The YWCA's women's housing and childcare programs will be significantly improved with this new addition. Furthermore, the new BayCoast Bank Teen Center and Highland Street Foundation Women's

Resource Center will be created as new community resources. This building addition will not only improve the YWCA's program effectiveness and financial health, it will allow our 103 year-old nonprofit business to make a greater contribution to our local economy.
